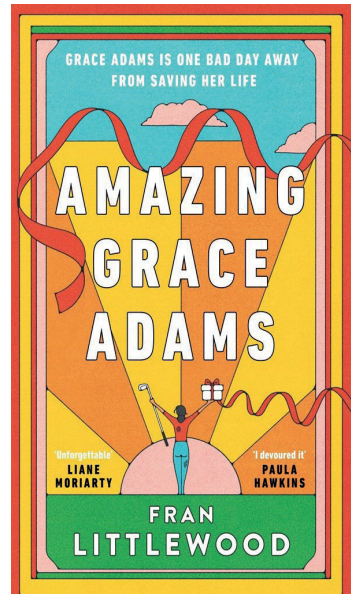
Grace Adams is one bad day away from saving her life

She was seeking nothing less than an entirely different life, having left the land far behind to call the wild, unbiddable sea home.

Our need for certainty has shaped human history, it determines your future and understanding it can transform your life.

Uncertainty is one of the defining issues of our time. The stability we once had is disappearing, and fast. Vast changes in society are shifting our realities: a global pandemic, changing attitudes and approaches to how we work undermining our ability to plan for the future. And, there is an ever decreasing sense of trust in the government, the media and education. Instead, we use the internet which provides us with a wave of conflicting advice.

When we can no longer make sense of the world together, insecurity takes over. We develop anxiety and confusion about our purpose, and in searching for certainty find it in autocratic leaders and populism. Democracy begins to fade as our uncertainty grows.
