But overnight the border between East and West closes, slicing the city - and the world - in two. With a city in chaos and armed guards ordered to shoot anyone who tries to cross, her situation is desperate.

Lisette's teenage daughter, Elly, has always struggled to understand the distance between herself and her mother. Both live for music but while Elly hears notes surrounding every person she meets, for her mother - once a talented pianist - the world has gone silent. Perhaps Elly can do something to bridge the gap between them. What begins as the flicker of an idea turns into a daring plan to escape East Berlin, find her baby brother, and bring him home...

Semiramis

Costanza Casati




Weaving together ancient history and myth, this captivating tale charts the controversial life and rise to power of Semiramis, the only female ruler of the Assyrian Empire.

Nothing about Semiramis's upbringing could have foretold her legacy or the power she would come to wield. A woman, an orphan raised on the outskirts of an empire - certainly no one in Ancient Assyria would bend to her command willingly. This is the epic tale of a woman who knew if she wanted power, she would have to claim it. No one was coming to save her.

There are whispers of her fame in Mesopotamian myth: Semiramis was a queen, an ambitious warrior, a commander and builder whose reputation reaches the majestic proportions of Alexander the Great. Historical record, on the other hand, falls early quiet.

In her second novel, Costanza Casati brilliantly weaves myth and ancient history together to give Semiramis a voice, charting her captivating ascent to a throne no one promised her. The world Casati expertly builds is rich with dazzling detail and will transport her readers to the heat of the Assyrian Empire and a world long gone.

Costanza Casati was born in Texas in 1995, grew up in a village in Northern Italy and lived in the UK for five years. Before moving to London, she attended a classical Liceo in Italy, where she studied Ancient Greek, and Ancient Greek literature, for five years. Costanza is a graduate of the prestigious Warwick Writing MA programme where she earned a distinction, and currently works as a freelance journalist and screenwriter. Her debut novel *Clytemnestra* published to great acclaim, it was a bestseller in its first week of publication, and has sold in fourteen languages.

The FiguresSophie Haydock



From the author of *The Flames*, comes a passionate love story about rivalry and art, a refugee and a wife, and about what a person might do for someone they love.

This is the story of two women – one, an orphan and refugee who finds a place in the studio of a famous French artist, the other, a wife and mother who has stood by her husband for nearly forty years.

Lydia Delectorskaya first met Henri Matisse in the South of France in the early 1930s, when she was in her twenties, and went on to become his muse. Although they were supposedly not romantically involved at the time,

Matisse's wife gave him an ultimatum - her or me.

Matisse chose his wife, and Lydia shot herself in the chest. However, the bullet bounced off her breastbone and she survived. Several years later, Matisse's wife left him anyway and Lydia reformed her connection with Matisse, which lasted until his death. When he died in 1954, she walked away immediately, taking only a suitcase she'd had packed for fifteen years.

This is a story of drama and betrayal; emotion and sex; glamour and tragedy, all set in the hotbed of the 1930s art movement in France. In art, as in life, this is a time when the rules were made to be broken...

Sophie Haydock is an award-winning author living in east London. *The Flames* is her debut novel and has been translated into eight languages. She is the winner of the Impress Prize for New Writers.




Two parents, a white American woman and British Muslim man, are thrown together in a race against time to find their radicalised children before they carry out a terrorist attack or are killed trying.


Will the FBI hunt their children down? Or will both fail to stop the teenagers committing an atrocity which derails the country's future?








The Escape Room



An Invitation to Die For Ada Moncrieff




Downtown Abbey meets Agatha Christie in this unputdownable Christmas murder mystery.

persecuted in the witch trials.




Kamil Rahman returns in *The Spy*. Where he and his amateursleuth restaurant manager partner Anjoli are thrown into the midst of a terrorist plot.



New York, 2015, a Monday in Spring. Dylan, about to turn thirtyeight, walks out of a successful career in advertising, sublets her apartment and agrees to house sit for Anna, an artist she has never met. She doesn't mention these life changes to her friends, her parents back in England or to Matt, her boyfriend living on the West Coast.

In Anna's loft Dylan has time to think, space to write and a chance to try on a new kind of life. When her neighbour Kate invites her to a party and introduces her to Gabe, Dylan tries on a new kind of romance. Gabe happens to be married to Kate but, according to Gabe, 'it's not a thing'. The more time Dylan spends with Gabe, the more she begins to believe it. As Spring turns to Summer Dylan's experiments in living test friendships, loyalties and the boundaries of herself, until an unexpected encounter between the two couples forces her to confront her future.

Miranda Pountney was born in North London. She read English Literature at Oxford University before embarking on a career in advertising—first in London, then in New York. In 2018 she graduated from the Bath Spa Creative Writing MA, with distinction. *How to Be Somebody Else* is her debut novel. It was pre-empted on a partial by Jonathan Cape.

Clinical Intimacy

Ewan Gass



The story of a mysterious man, told by a dozen distinct voices, each differently mesmerized by him; in turns uncanny and alluring, the novel asks fundamental, provocative questions about sex, power, privacy, care and who has the right to those things.

A researcher lays out her investigative parameters. Her subject? A mysterious man known only as X. Her interviewees? A dozen distinct people - his mother, his childhood best friend, his wife - each differently mesmerized by him. As we read and we wonder what makes X so magnetic, so charismatic, we also watch X unravel.


This is a novel about hyper-subjectivity: are we the story we tell about ourselves, or the stories others tell about us? Approached obliquely only via others, X is a cipher assembled bit by bit. It is also a novel that delights in juxtaposition; a novel about fatherhood and sex work, a novel about how we narrativize our lives without ever giving voice to the subject at its centre. It's a literary experiment in collectivity, a detective story, and a psychogeography of crisis.



Caliban Shrieks

Jack Hilton



A lyrical tour of life as a young working-class man born into the first days of the 20th century, *Caliban Shrieks* is a lost masterpiece of 1930s British literature.

From a childhood of poverty but deep joy and high-flying freedom, to the hard-knock reality of physical labour, and then the ideological idiocies of life of a solider, *Caliban Shrieks* takes its readers on a lyrical tour of life as a young man born into the first days of the 20th century.

This is the story of a young man, seeing England from city to city, county to county, before returning to an uncertain cycle of working-class life in the post-war years. An autobiographical novel, it is both a brash, impassioned indictment of the conditions of the working-class, and a modernist retelling of the myth of wild men: disfigured, disenfranchised, and sold into slavery.

Lost to time, only to be rediscovered again in the Salford's Working Class Movement Library in 2022, *Caliban Shrieks* is a masterpiece of both modernist and working class literature, and continues to speak as angrily and impassioned today, as it did on its first rave publication in 1935.

Jack Hilton was born at the very turn of the 20th century. Growing up poor he entered work as a child, before fighting in the First World War. On his return he became a vagrant, which took him from city to city, and county to county. An active member of the National Unemployed Worker's Movement, Hilton was forced to retire from public speaking for three years after being arrested at a demonstration. He used this period of his life to pen his first novel, the autobiographical *Caliban Shrieks*. During his fifteen-year career as a writer he published a further four books and enjoyed the support of writers such as George Orwell. However, plastering was his trade, and after failing to publish beyond 1950 he continued to skim houses throughout the Lancashire area until his retirement, and death in the 1980s. His works have long-remained out of print, and despite several efforts, the rights to Hilton's book were thought lost until their discovery in 2022.

Murder in Florence

Thomas Harding



A gripping true crime investigation about the murder of the wife and two daughters of Robert Einstein, cousin of Albert Einstein, in Nazi occupied Florence.

During a writing retreat to Florence in 2022, Thomas Harding finds himself and his wife, Debora, living only 10km away from the villa II Focardo where the wife and children of Robert Einstein, Albert Einstein's cousin, were murdered by Nazi soldiers.

The author was inspired not only by the unsolved triple-murder and its backdrop against WWII Fascist Italy, but the proximity of the Einstein family's story to his own German-Jewish heritage. As such, Harding embarks on an investigation that he insists is as paramount today with the revival of the farright across international politics as it was in 1944.

Thomas Harding is a bestselling author whose books have been translated into more than sixteen languages. He has written for the *Sunday Times*, the *Washington Post* and the *Guardian*, among other publications. He is the author of *Hanns And Rudolf*, which won the JQ-Wingate Prize for Non-Fiction; *The House By The Lake*, which was shortlisted for the Costa Biography Award; *Blood On The Page*, which won the Crime Writers' Association "Golden Dagger Award for Non-Fiction"; *Future History*, which was nominated for the German Youth Literature Award 'Best Youth Book' in 2021; *The House By The Lake* (picture book edition) which was nominated for the Kate Greenaway Medal 2022; and *White Debt* which was longlisted for the Moore Prize for Human Rights Writing.

Homer's Women

The Untold Story of the Real Women Behind Greece's Greatest Epics and Why They Matter Emily Hauser

There has never been a better time to be a woman in Homer... It follows in the footsteps of each of Homer's women in turn, from Helen of Troy, Briseis, Chryseis and Cassandra to Circe, Clytemnestra, Calypso and Penelope, rereading and re-interpreting the ancient history and the original texts, drawing on recent scientific discoveries and unravelling extraordinary new archaeological evidence in search of the real women in Homer.

Emily Hauser studied Classics at Cambridge, where she was taught by Mary Beard. She completed a PhD at Yale University, was a Junior Fellow at Harvard University and is now Lecturer in Classics and Ancient History at Exeter University. She has previously written novels set in ancient Greece and bringing some of its forgotten stories to life: For the Most Beautiful, For the Winner, and and For the Immortal.

It has become normal to tell kids that they're going to die from climate change. If a heatwave doesn't get them, then drought will. Or sea-level rise; famine; or a supercharged hurricane. It's not surprising that most young people today feel like their future is in grave peril.





Finding an apparently perfect world at Akenside Priory, and a haven after the loss of her father, Catherine Coldstream trusts herself to a group of twenty silent women, believing she is trusting herself to God. As the beauty and mystery of an ancient way of life enfolds her, she surrenders herself wholly to its power, only to find that all is not as it seems behind the Order's closed doors.

Cut off from the wider world for decades, the community has managed to evade accountability to any authority beyond itself. When Sister Catherine realises that a toxic cult of the personality has replaced the ancient ideal of religious obedience, she is faced with a dilemma. Will she submit even to this, or will she be forced to speak out?

An exploration of the limits of trust, *Cloistered* shows us how far grief can take us along the road of self-surrender, and of how much harm is done when institutional flaws go unacknowledged. She is a viola player and choral singer and lives in Oxford.
