THE BOOK

Adolescence is the most dramatic and formative period of our lives. At times thrilling, occasionally traumatic, it is when we become who we are, when the smallest things can have life-long effects. But it is also full of contradictions, making it bewildering to live through and widely misunderstood. We may struggle to connect with the adolescents in our lives, but most of us have yet to come to terms with our own adolescence and how it has shaped us.

In this expert, empowering book, Lucy Foulkes draws on the latest research and in-depth interviews to demystify adolescent behaviours – friendship, risk-taking, sex, love, bullying and more – and expose the surprising and often moving reality. We see that teenagers are far more conservative than rebellious; that apparent recklessness is often calculated and risk-averse; that popularity is a mixed blessing even as friendships can be a life-changing good. We understand why social hierarchies are so fiercely policed, even while adolescents have an extraordinary capacity for empathy and mutual support; why appearances are overly important, and why rejection at this age hurts so much. Revealing the underlying truths of adolescence, she shows that even the most difficult experiences are part of this essential and life-shaping process of self-discovery.

If our identities are a story, then the crucial first draft is written in adolescence. *Coming of Age* helps us read that story with clarity and compassion so that we can appreciate the adolescents we know but also those we once were – those wild and fragile people who helped us become who we are.

THE AUTHOR

Dr Lucy Foulkes is an academic psychologist. She is currently a Prudence Trust Research Fellow at the University of Oxford, where she leads research into adolescent mental health and social development. She is also an honorary lecturer in psychology at UCL. She is the author of What Mental Illness Really Is (and What It Isn't) and has written for the Guardian, New Scientist and other publications. Her work has been discussed on BBC 2's Newsnight and reported in The Times, Economist, New York Times and Atlantic, and she has appeared on BBC Radio 4's All in the Mind and Start the Week.





Anima A Wild Pastoral

Kapka Kassabova

The spellbinding new book by the prizewinning writer Kapka Kassabova tells the story of her time with the last nomadic pastoralists in Europe: a gripping portrayal of human-animal interdependence, and a plea for a different way of living.

THE BOOK

For thousands of years, humans and grazing animals moved with the seasons in search of pasture. On the flanks of the Pirin Mountains, the last true pastoralists continue this ancient practice as a way of life. Here, the paths are formed by dogs, shepherds, horses and sheep, moving together. Few people survive a whole summer in the alpine highlands, where human lives are as precarious as the lives of animals they care for – or who care for them.

In *Anima*, Kapka Kassabova lives with one of these communities, experiencing the intensity, brutality, beauty and isolation of their existence over one summer. She witnesses the epic, orchestrated activity of transhumance – the seasonal movement of vast herds of sheep, along with shepherds and dogs. As she becomes attuned to the sacrifices inherent in this work and the rich histories that shaped this Balkan region, Kassabova finds herself drawn deeper into the tangled relationships at the heart of the small community.

Anima is an extraordinary portrayal of pastoral life, where humans and animals exist in profound interdependence. Kassabova conjures the spirit of this remarkable place with intimacy and empathy, and helps us imagine how we might all begin to heal our broken relationship with the natural world.

THE AUTHOR

Kapka Kassabova is a poet and prose writer and, most recently, the author of Elixir (2023), To the Lake (2020) and Border (2017). Border won a British Academy Prize, the Scottish Book of the Year, Stanford-Dolman Travel Book of the Year, the Highland Book Prize and the Prix Nicholas Bouvier. It was also a finalist for the National Book Critics Circle Award. The French edition of To the Lake won the Prix du Meilleur Livre Etranger (non-fiction). Kassabova grew up in Sofia, Bulgaria, and studied in New Zealand. Today she lives by a river in the Scottish Highlands. Anima is the final book in her Balkan quartet exploring the relationship between humans and their environment, following Border, To the Lake, and Elixir.





The title of Michael Longley's *New Selected Poems* is taken from his poem 'Ash Keys'. The wing-shaped, wind-borne seeds of the ash-tree might be an image for poems in search of their readers. This selection, based on thirteen individual collections, represents Longley's unusual range as a lyric poet.

It shows how his themes, genres and forms have evolved and interlaced since the 1960s. Love, violence, the natural world, art, psychodrama, family, the Great War, the Homeric past and Northern Ireland's troubled present cohabit in these pages – as do depth, wit and beauty. Longley's poems of the west of Ireland, which pivot on Carrigskeewaun, his 'soul landscape', have also made him a pioneer of 'eco-poetry'.

In 2022 Longley was awarded the Feltrinelli Prize for poetry, a major international prize. Announcing the award, the Accademia dei Lincei in Rome stressed 'the contemporary relevance of his themes and their cultural implications', and said: 'Longley is an extraordinary poet of landscape, particularly of the Irish West, which he observes with the delicate and passionate attention of an ecologist, and a tragic singer of Ireland and its dramatic history. But he has also addressed the seduction, conquest, and fascination of love, as well as the shock of war in all ages, the tragedy of the Holocaust and of the gulags, and the themes of loss, grief and pity.'

My Battle of Hastings

Xiaolu Guo

The new memoir in a triptych from prize-winning writer and filmmaker Xiaolu Guo in which she moves to Hastings to find a room of her own and immerses herself in local history

THE BOOK

Embodiment, assimilation, integration – these are big words, but they seem to name a stage or a state I ought to be able to achieve in my brief life.

In winter 2021, Xiaolu Guo bought a tiny dilapidated flat on the Hastings seafront, a room of her own where she could spend time writing away from her domestic duties as a mother and wife in London. As Russia invaded Ukraine, she immersed herself in the English landscape and its past, especially the violence between Normans and Saxons.

My Battle of Hastings is a chronicle of Xiaolu's life in Hastings and a portrait of a dislocated artist seeking to connect with her local environment in the hope of finding a deeper connection to her adoptive nation. Filled with profound, beautiful and wry reflections on war, history, migration and belonging, Xiaolu's journey into the past completes the triptych of memoirs that began with Once Upon a Time in the East, charting her childhood in China, then continued with Radical: A Life of My Own in search of a freedom beyond her home.

My Battle of Hastings is above all an exploration of how an immigrant, an outsider and a woman can embrace local and national history.


THE AUTHOR

Xiaolu Guo was born in China. She published six books before moving to Britain in 2002. Her books include: *Village of Stone*, shortlisted for the Independent Foreign Fiction Prize; *A Concise Chinese-English Dictionary for Lovers*, shortlisted for the Orange Prize; and *I Am China*. Her recent memoir, *Once Upon a Time in the East*, won the National Book Critics Circle Award, was shortlisted for the Costa Biography Award and the Rathbones Folio Prize 2018. It was a Sunday Times Book of the Year. Her most recent novel *A Lover's Discourse* was shortlisted for the Goldsmiths Prize 2020. She is a fellow of the Royal Society of Literature and a visiting professor at the Free University in Berlin.

Mark Haddon is a writer and artist. His bestselling novel, *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time*, was published simultaneously by Jonathan Cape and David Fickling in 2003. THE BOOK

A heartfelt graphic memoir of love, family and fearless women

Lives were bent in the furnaces of the twentieth century, but Granny was unbroken. With a stethoscope, a jar of herring and a hearing aid occasionally switched on, she forged an extraordinary life. Elena Zadik ran through the twentieth century without looking back.

A refugee twice before she was 17, training in medicine in Sheffield during World War 2, she was as brilliant a doctor as she was terrible a driver (she never took a test). Following her childhood in Ukraine during the Russian civil war in a tiny Jewish family (her parents were first cousins) to a briefly peaceful childhood in Germany, then to the UK as lone teenage refugee in 1937, the story shows Elena breaking glass ceilings to become a doctor. Practising in working class Sheffield she sees terrible deprivation and rejoices at the founding of the NHS, to which she gives 40 years' service.

She finds belonging in a Lancastrian mill and mining town as a GP, witnessing the destruction of the 1980s on the industry and culture of the town, as her own career and life wanes. Her parents die in Auschwitz, she spends decades fighting for restitution, and then shares the money she finally receives among her nine grandchildren.

Miriam, her eldest granddaughter, tells her story reflecting on their unconventional relationship and how trauma travels down through the generations. Elena was an unintentionally hilarious woman, often difficult, always opinionated and deeply resourceful. Her hands (minus her left index finger which she slammed in garage doors) were always busy and form the heart of this timely graphic story of the ordinary extraordinary resilience of women.


THE BOOK

I was standing outside an apartment block that had been split apart by a missile. The words of a poem came to me when I could no longer find my own.

In nearly four decades as a journalist covering conflict from Palestine to Kosovo to Rwanda, Channel 4 News International Editor Lindsey Hilsum has always carried a book of poetry. THE BOOK

Handel's *Messiah* is the most performed piece of classical music ever written and one of the most enduring expressions of hope in the darkness. In this superbly written and effortlessly readable history, Charles King reveals the drama of intertwined lives that lies behind its creation, involving some of the most famous, scandalous, brilliant and moving personalities of the 18th century.

These include Charles Jennings, the melancholic obsessive who compiled its unusual libretto; Susannah Cibber, the spectacularly exploited, ultra-famous actress whose moving performance of the Messiah transformed her into one of the most revered figures in theatrical history; Thomas Coram, whose foundling hospital became the annual venue for performances of the Messiah; Jonathan Swift, the rageful, ailing satirist who almost prevented it from being premiered; Ayuba Diallo, an enslaved African who became a celebrity of the era; and of course Handel himself, a German immigrant famous for his stratospheric rise under the new Hanoverian regime as well as his foul-mouthed wit.

Through their collective story, King shows Handel's *Messiah* to be not only the creation of his musical genius but an encapsulation of the era in which he lived — a time of extraordinary political tumult, uncertainty and fear, which shaped Britain and the world to this day - and thus why this extraordinary piece of music still moves people so profoundly, bringing audiences to their feet for its iconic Hallelujah chorus every year.

Charles King is Professor of International Affairs at Georgetown University, Washington DC, and the author of numerous books, including most recently the New York Times bestseller The Reinvention of Humanity, which won The Francis Parkman Prize for Biography and was shortlisted for the British Academy Prize and the National Book Critics Circle Award. 
It's the turn of the new millennium in India. Kay Sohini is an impressionable undergraduate studying English in the suburbs of Calcutta, hungrily consuming the America imported in cheesy sitcoms and fast food. When she dives headlong into an abusive relationship that leaves her in pieces, Kay, in desperation, books a one-way flight to New York City.

Here, at last, exploring the haunts and hideouts of her literary heroes – Kerouac, Plath, Bechdel – and rediscovering the ritual of preparing the meals she was raised on, she has room to begin the work of slowly piecing herself together. But it's this same place, home to the west's self-mythology and world's broke, burnt-out dreamers, that threatens to break her all over again.

This is not another ode to New York. A wise, endlessly relatable blend of political meditations and self-help manifesto with a sprinkle of recipe, *This Beautiful, Ridiculous City* is about how easy it is to fall beautifully, ridiculously in love, how the places and people we love do not always love us back but somehow still save us in weird, unexpected ways.

THE AUTHOR

Kay Sohini is an academic in New York City. She drew her doctoral dissertation, "Drawing Unbelonging", as a comic, and the project was supported by the Mellon Foundation. *This Beautiful, Ridiculous City* is her first book.



How fiction responded to a century of fact

For more than two decades, Edwin Frank has introduced readers to forgotten or overlooked texts as director of the acclaimed publisher New York Review Books. In *Stranger than Fiction*, he offers a legendary editor's survey of the key works that defined the twentieth-century novel.

Starting with Dostoevsky's *Notes from Underground* (1864), Frank shows how its twitchy, self-undermining narrator established a voice that would echo through the coming century. He illuminates Gertrude Stein and Ernest Hemingway's reinvention of the American sentence; Colette and André Gide's subversions of traditional gender roles; and the monumental ambitions of works such as *Mrs Dalloway*, *The Magic Mountain* and *The Man Without Qualities* to encompass their times. Frank also shows how Japan's Soseki and Nigeria's Chinua Achebe adapted European models to their own ends – and how Vasily Grossman, Hans Erich Nossack and Elsa Morante did the same as they attempted to reckon with the traumas of World War II. Later chapters range from Ralph Ellison and Marguerite Yourcenar to Gabriel Garcia Marquez and WG Sebald.

In the manner of Alex Ross's *The Rest Is Noise*, Frank makes sense of the century by mixing biographical portraiture, cultural history and close encounters with great works of art. In so doing he renews our appreciation of the paradigmatic art form of our times.
